

Expand your skills

The one-year Asante Rogue Regional PGY-1 Pharmacy Residency Program offers opportunities for postgraduate professional growth. In addition to the required training segments, the program allows numerous elective opportunities to complement your career goals. The program begins in late June. Benefits include paid vacation and holidays; sick leave; medical, dental and vision insurance coverage; travel to selected conferences; and dedicated office space.

The program builds on Doctor of Pharmacy, or PharmD, education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions. Those who complete the program are eligible for both board certification and postgraduate year-two, or PGY-2, pharmacy residency training.

Timeline

The application deadline is Jan. 1.


Interviews are conducted in late January through early March, and the program begins in late June.

Requirements

Residency applicants must:

- 1. Possess or be receiving a Doctor of Pharmacy degree
- 2. Be licensed or eligible for licensure in the state of Oregon
- 3. Participate in the Match
- 4. Submit a completed PhORCAS application that includes:
 - Individual Assessment for Residency Training form (available at www.asante.org/pharmacy-residency)
 - Three references
 - Pharmacy college transcripts
 - Letter of intent
- 5. Complete a formal interview
