Salem Hospital

- Founded in 1896

Salem Health Pharmacy Services

- ~101 staff members
 - 57 technicians, 44 pharmacists
 - Includes Meds to Beds, Ambulatory Clinic, Outpatient and Specialty Pharmacy programs
- Decentralized clinical services

- Multidisciplinary rounds in multiple areas



Salem Health Pharmacy Services

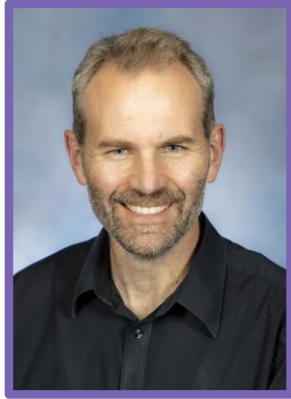
- Centralized unit dose distribution

Program History

- Started in 2013, 13 graduated residents
- Currently accepting two residents annually
- Program Purpose
 - To build on the Doctor of Pharmacy education and to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

Staffing Requirements

- 32 Hours/month
 - Two 8-hr shifts every other weekend
 - Receive day off Monday following staffing
- First half of the year
 - Main Pharmacy
- Second half of the year
 - Decentral

Meeting Attendance

 - Travel costs covered for each resident
 - Poster submission required
- Northwestern States Residency Conference
 - Typically in May
 - Opportunity to present Residency Research Project

Residency Project

- Research or Quality Improvement focused
- Possible ideas generated by RAC and residency preceptors each year
- Mentorship - pharmacist + interdisciplinary team in many cases

Resident Project Examples

- 2021-22** Evaluating the Impact of a Vancomycin Dosing Protocol Utilizing a Pharmacokinetic Calculator and AUC-guided Dosing
Evaluation of a Pharmacist-led Therapeutic Heparin Protocol
- 2019-20** Early versus Late Midodrine Initiation in Patients with Sepsis and Septic Shock Requiring Intravenous Vasopressors in the Intensive Care Unit
Implementation of a pharmacist-led procalcitonin-guided algorithm for the management of community acquired pneumonia
- 2018-19** Fixed-dose & Weight-based Dosing of Prothrombin Complex Concentrate (PCC): A Comparison of 3-factor PCC (Profilnine®) & 4-factor PCC (Kcentra®) for Warfarin Reversal
Implementation of a Probiotic Algorithm on Readmission Rates in Patients with C. difficile Infection
- 2017-18** Accuracy of Clinical Pharmacist Self-Reporting: A Time and Motion Study

Teaching and Learning Experience

- Participation in Oregon Pharmacy Teaching Certificate (OPTC) program is required
 - Jointly operated by the Oregon State University College of Pharmacy and Pacific University School of Pharmacy
 - Residents that successfully complete all required teaching activities will be awarded a teaching certificate

Teaching and Learning Experience

- Presentation Opportunities
 - Two formal presentations to pharmacy staff
 - Three journal clubs to pharmacy staff
 - One multidisciplinary in-service
 - Smoking cessation presentation
 - Chemeketa Community College
 - Part of OPTC experience

Medication Use Evaluation (MUE)

- Complete one during course of the year
- Present findings to Pharmacy & Therapeutics Committee

Drug Monograph

- Part of P&T evaluation process
- Present to Pharmacy & Therapeutics Committee

Medical Emergency Response

- Residents receive upfront training Basic Life Support (BLS), Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) and Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS)
- Have the opportunity to actively participate in hospital-wide code blue responses throughout residency year

Salary & Benefits

- Current salary is ~\$51,000 per year
- Dedicated laptop and working space
