



OREGON SOCIETY OF HEALTH-SYSTEM PHARMACISTS: COUNCILS AND COMMITTEES

Educational Affairs Council (EAC) The EAC governs the educational and training activities of OSHP, including the educational component of the OSHP seminars and chapter meetings. The EAC is active in assuring the quality of continuing education offered by OSHP, including ACPE accredited CE, and seeks to provide CE which satisfies members legal and professional requirements. The EAC undertakes additionally special projects as needed by the Board of Directors and administers the OSHP student scholarship program.

Membership Council (MC) The Membership Council serves to assess member needs and opinions, develops member services and benefits, critiques new programs and services, and develops ways to recruit new members and retain existing members. The council supervises current member services and explores the development of new services. These goals are accomplished through member surveys to determine what is important to our members, membership drives, and facilitating OSHP events.

Professional Relations Council (PRC) Through involvement in the Professional Relations Council, OSHP members are exposed to a variety of pharmacy matters, including the development and improvement of the professional practice of pharmacy in hospitals and related institutions, the development of standards, guides and related materials, and cooperation with allied organizations and agencies.

Other Opportunities

Annual Seminar Committee This EAC subcommittee organizes and oversees the Society's largest event of the year, the Annual Seminar. It is held over the course of a weekend in the spring. Committee members start planning the event in September. They arrange all aspects of the seminar including the location, speakers, and entertainment.

Industrial Relations Committee The Industrial Relations Committee (IRC) is a subcommittee of the PRC and serves to develop the partnership between OSHP's pharmacist-members and its pharmaceutical industry partner-members.

Legal & Regulatory Affairs Committee Legal and Regulatory Affairs is a subcommittee of the PRC and is responsible for review and interpretation of proposed legislation and actual changes in laws, rules and regulations affecting public health, pharmacy and hospital pharmacy practice and for interpretation and application of state Society principles and ethics.
